





Z.G., a standout student participating in our Project RESIST in Belle Glade, received a \$500 book scholarship from GA to support his pursuit of higher education in Business Administration at Morehouse College. Actively engaged in our program sessions, Z.G. attests, "Participating in these sessions helped me learn how to cope with life circumstances." These sessions not only foster lasting relationships among students and teachers but also enhance communication skills and promote healthy dialogues within the home. GA remains dedicated to providing a safe and supportive learning environment for students and families. empowering them to thrive. Z.G. credits Project RESIST workshops for equipping him with coping strategies and improved communication skills, acknowledging the invaluable support from program staff who shared their own experiences.

Isaiah, a participant in our GPS K-5 afterschool program, diligently studied with our staff for the prestigious 5000 Role Model National Spelling Bee. We are proud to announce that he emerged victorious in the first round and has earned the opportunity to compete in the final competition scheduled for April 2024.



Ms. C, a mother of seven whose partner is incarcerated, was referred to GA's Project UPLIFT by a Miami-Dade County Public School administrator. She needed assistance with her 13-year-old daughter, who had recently discovered she was pregnant. Facing challenges with rent, Emergency Medicaid, and WIC for her daughter, Ms. C turned to UPLIFT for support. Through intervention of the UPLIFT program team, Ms. C secured better-paying employment, preventing further financial strain. Additionally, her daughter obtained WIC and Emergency Medicaid, and the family received assistance with two months' worth of rent through temporary family stabilization funds. The family was referred to GA's COS program for counseling and to our COSP program for parenting classes, contributing to their stabilization. Ms. C expressed unwavering gratitude for the comprehensive care and support provided by the UPLIFT program team.

D. P. is an 8th grader attending a Miami-Dade County Public School. He has faced significant challenges, as he has never met his father, and his mother, who struggled with serious mental health issues and economic instability, found it difficult to maintain employment and support their family. D.P. experienced feelings of sadness and loneliness and showed symptoms of depression. Through participation in within our therapeutic sessions COS program, D.P. has exhibited remarkable progress. These sessions, geared towards enhancing social skills, fostering confidence peer relationships, and improving in academic performance and behavior, have proven instrumental in his development. Today, D.P. proudly serves as an active member of a junior varsity basketball team and has recently attained Honor Roll status, showcasing his resilience and unwavering determination to overcome obstacles.

J. R., currently 21 years old, is a trainee in our YouthBuild program and has shown remarkable progress since joining in July 2023. Despite facing significant barriers common among opportunity youth, including family, socioeconomic, and legal challenges, Mr. Rivera has demonstrated exceptional determination and commitment to his success. Within just 4 months, he achieved his high school diploma through the support of the YouthBuild program team with a commendable 3.0 GPA. Additionally, through the program, he completed NCCER certification training in introductory craft skills in construction. Furthermore, his overall behavior and attitude toward personal growth have shown significant improvement, reflecting his dedication to achieving his goals.

In the midst of adolescence, A. A., a 16-year-old middle school student, confronted the challenging realities of her mother's opioid use. Responding swiftly to her needs, our OPP program promptly enrolled her in afterschool programming, extending crucial support to both her and her family during this critical period. As our comprehensive services unfolded, including therapeutic sessions and tutoring, it became evident that A. A. faced unique educational obstacles. Despite her age, she grappled with the demands of middle school. Recognizing this gap, our staff intervened with unwavering advocacy, acknowledging the importance of an Individualized Education Plan (IEP) in her academic journey and advocating for its implementation. Our efforts were fueled by the belief that, at 16, A. A. deserved an educational experience tailored to her needs. Through persistent advocacy, we not only secured the much-needed IEP but also ensured her placement in the correct grade. This strategic intervention became a turning point, allowing A. A. to not only overcome her struggles but to flourish academically in an environment that finally aligned with her unique circumstances. This success story is a testament to the transformative power of GA's personalized support and dedicated advocacy.


