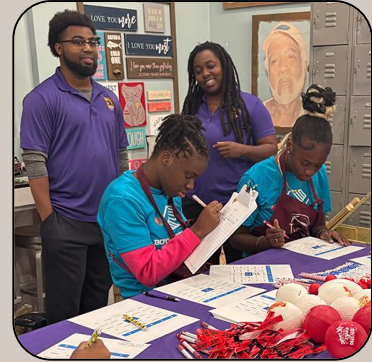

## Project BRAVE's Stand Against Bullying

This October, Gang Alternative Inc's (GA) Project BRAVE led a month-long Anti-Bullying Challenge, bringing students together to spread kindness during National Bullying Prevention Month!

In recognition of the occasion, Project BRAVE launched its Anti-Bullying Youth Leadership Program, engaging students from Broward County schools

in a four-week inter-school challenge. This initiative aims to cultivate awareness, empathy, and leadership while fostering unity among youth.

Each week focused on a core theme, "What Is Bullying", "Be an Upstander", "Pause Before You Post", and "Together We Rise", encouraging students to reflect, create, and take meaningful action. From creating inspiring posters to sharing videos about what kindness means, students used their voices and creativity to stand up for others, culminating in a celebration and poster contest showcase.

On October 20, Project BRAVE joined the Urban League of Broward County for the Anti-Bullying Teen Summit, standing together for peace and kindness! The goal was to amplify youth voices and inspire students to be Upstanders – championing empathy, inclusion, and the courage to stand up for others.

By uniting schools and community partners, Project BRAVE continues its goals of building resiliency through anti-violence education, fostering safe, inclusive spaces where every student feels empowered to lead with kindness during National Bullying Prevention Month and beyond.

It's one thing to read about a career, but to actually interact with someone who is currently in that specific field provides information you can't find online. ## GA Client Success: Eugene Hunter Jr.

In 2021, Eugene Hunter was released from a 19-year prison sentence. Eugene needed some marketable skills to qualify him for meaningful employment. At the time, he was also unhoused and had no place to call home. One thing he knew for sure is that he was mentally and physically strong and filled with determination. He wanted a better life yet lacked the resources and support to do so.



He enrolled in one of GA's workforce development programs, and Eugene's life quickly started to improve. Eugene enrolled in a free Commercial Drivers License (CDL) course offered by GA. We also helped him update his resume, participate in mock interview practices and provided appropriate clothing for job interviews.

Eugene now felt better prepared with the tools he needed to transform his life. It was not long before he landed a job driving for the Coca Cola company. As a result, he was able to secure permanent housing and significantly improve his quality of life. Since that time, he has held truck driving positions for two other major companies, Cisco and US Foods.

Although his children are now independent and self-sustaining, he prides himself on being able to financially and emotionally support his grandchildren. He credits GA for helping him gain the training, which gave him a career.

He now regularly goes into correctional facilities to share his story in hopes of inspiring those who are now where he once was, as he firmly believes that

## Substance Use Prevention Month



October is Substance Use Prevention Month, and Gang Alternative is proud to engage our community in dynamic ways because "it's a vibe to be drug-free." Our mission is fueled by strong partnerships, parent involvement, and the collective strength of our community. Through the creativity and voices of the youth we serve, we remain committed to preventing substance use while promoting community upliftment.





This month, there were several events to promote drug-free behavior. Our prevention team participated in the Broward County Student Wellness Fair, engaging over 100 students with gamified activities that reinforced positive decision-making and life skills. During Red Ribbon Week (October 23–31), Gang Alternative’s tabling events across Broward County empowered students to lead and educate their peers under the national theme, “Life is a Puzzle, Let’s Solve It Drug-Free.” Students are also creating original drug-free artwork, using creativity to express their commitment to healthy choices. This initiative encourages self-expression, peer support, and a positive school culture, while highlighting the important role youth play in substance use prevention.

On October 25, Gang Alternative hosted a Youth Mental Health First Aid certification, equipping parents, educators, and service providers to recognize and respond to early signs of youth mental health challenges.

We are also honored to have also partnered with the National Guard and Margate Police Department for DEA Prescription Take Back Day, providing a safe and anonymous way to dispose of unused medications. We’re excited to wrap up Red Ribbon Week with our Trunk or Treat event, featuring Narcan prevention education and fun, drug-free activities for families.
